#### I. Role of the Department

Training and capacity building is conceived as one of the most important activities of a growing organization. Training has the potential of bringing about change in the attitude and enables in enhancing performance of the personnel serving any organization. Training and capacity building therefore, needs to be looked as a fruitful exercise for the development of any organization. There is a need for creating institutional and departmental scope for proper and adequate programmes of capacity building not only for developing individual skills/capacities but also for nurturing the talents of the personnel for effectively serving the organization and ultimately for its development.

In the light of the importance and potential which the activities of training and capacity building carry, NUEPA has embarked upon creating a specialized *Department of Training and Capacity Building in Education* on 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2012. Creation of this department added fillip to the activities of NUEPA more particularly in the light of importance it places on training and capacity building programmes for the benefit of the educational planers and administrators of the country as well as the countries which are entering into the path of development.

Some of the main activities of the Department are as follows:

- (a) Conducting two major diploma programmes annually: Post Graduate DiplomaProgramme in Educational Planning and Administration (PGDEPA) and International Diploma in Educational Planning and Administration (IDEPA).
- (b) Designing and conducting training (pre-induction) for *the newly recruited Education Officers* (Provincial Officers) of the various state governments
- (c) Continuous support and capacity building of the *Faculty members of SIEMATs* of India and also providing inputs in establishing SIEMATs in other states.
- (d) Organizing all request programmes and outreach programmes from Central and State Governments as well as International request/sponsored programmes.
- (e) Organizing short term training programmes in areas of national importance like education for minority and tribal communities..
- (f) Carrying out Research in training and capacity building strategies in education.

#### **Vision of the Department**

- Creating linkages at the state and international levels for improving the capacities of their administrators.
- Empowering State Institutions by creating more stable and dedicated institutional arrangement for creating a critical mass of trained teams in the Departments of Education.
- Reaching out to the Grassroots: Through State Conferences for efficient implementation of the national programmes for the DEOs/BEOs all over the nation in a phased manner,

to articulate the important programmes and policies of educational reforms which are in progress in the country.

- To organize training programs on request at national and international level to the need based thematic and cadre based courses particularly for trainees at the induction and promotion level.
- To conduct research in training and capacity building strategies in education at national and international level with a focus on educational training need studies of different cadres of functionaries, field officers and administrators from school and higher education level.

Introduction	Specific Learning Disability (SLD) of any one or more types (four Ds and ADHD) is found in 20 percent of children. Though it has been included as one of the disability in 2016 Act and rules of its diagnosis notified by Ministry of health in 2017, it has not yet been addressed by education department. The Act has specific clause on its early identification. Samagra Abhiyan and circulars of directorates address all twenty one disabilities together. But SLD being invisible disability more over children bestowed with average or higher IQ get missed out. The data reveals that their identification is at 0.1 percent instead of

	20 percent and pass outs at 5 % rather at 100 %. The retention and pass out rate as well as passing percentage of children with SLD can be improved or could be made 100 % with the help of a comprehensive policy. Such policy documents, manuals are available in other countries but it is not available in India for SLD. A policy dialogue will help in preparation of such a policy from right perspective.
