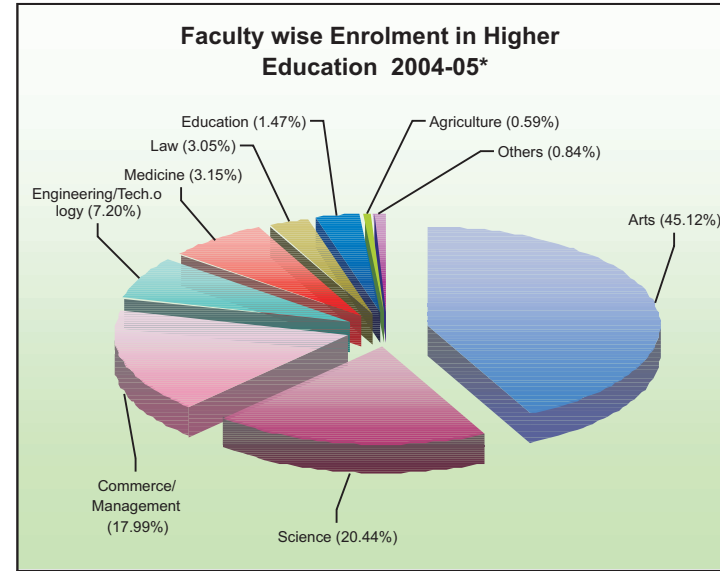
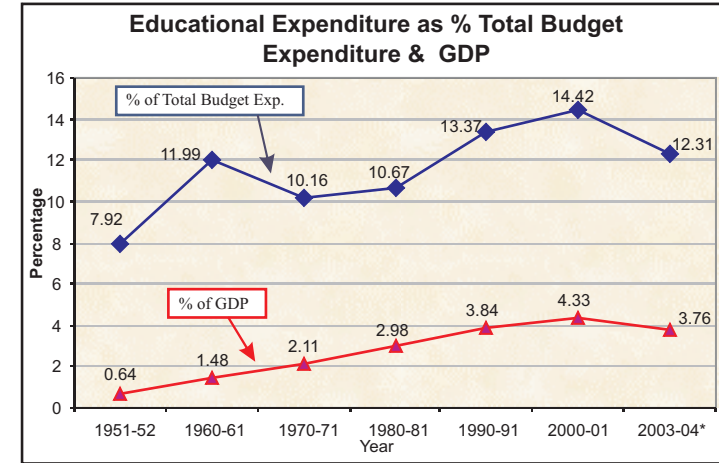

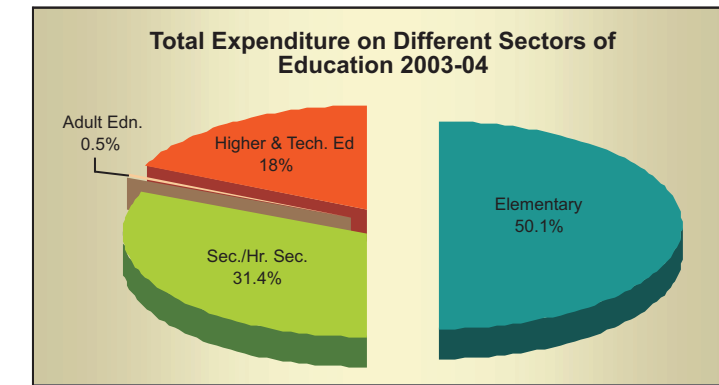

EXPENDITURE ON EDUCATION

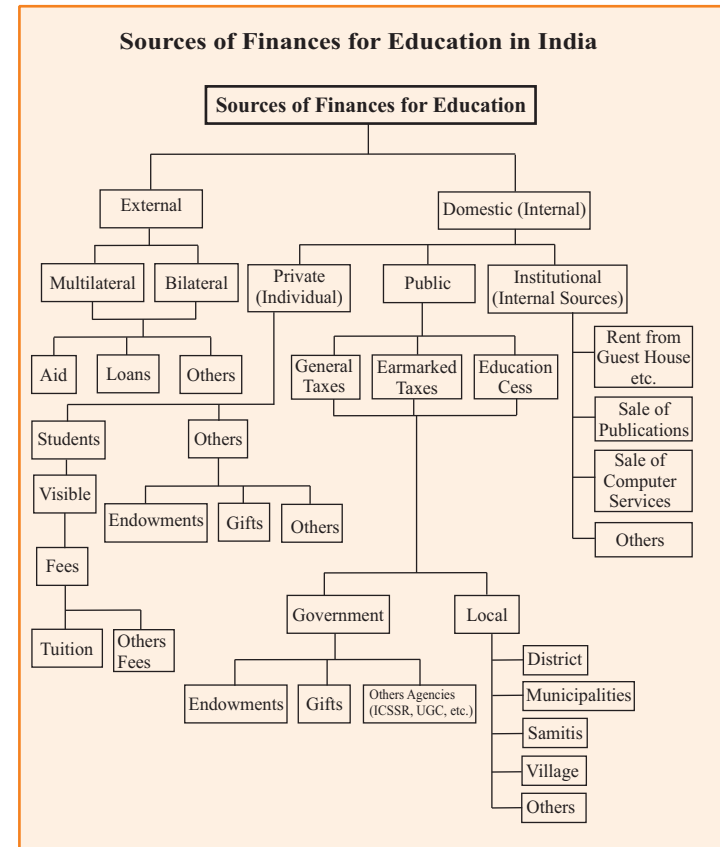

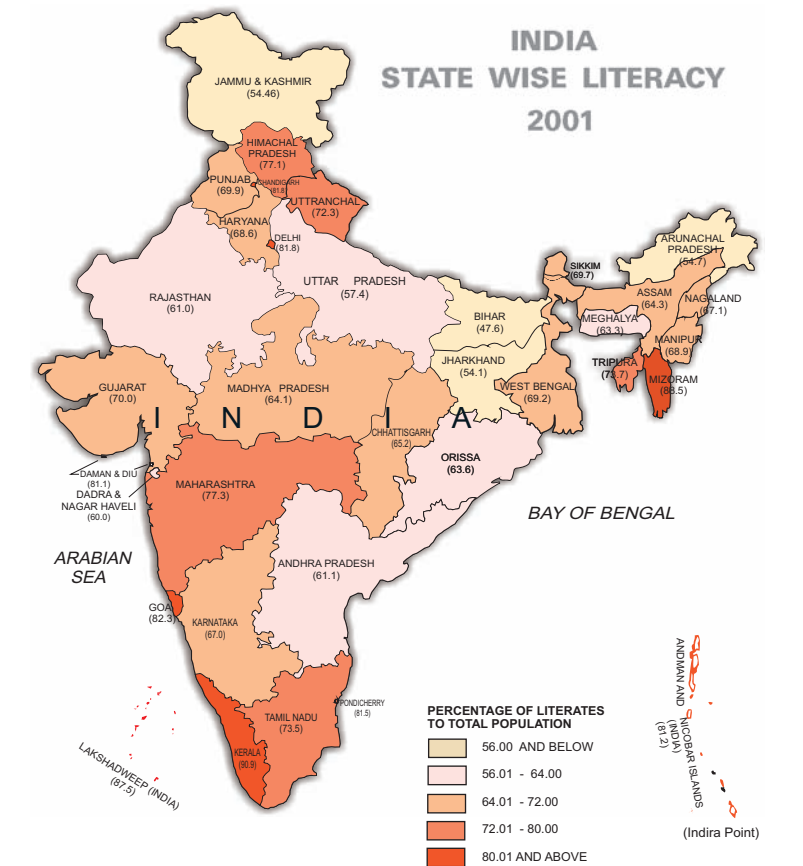
