




EXPENDITURE ON EDUCATION







Constitutional Provisions for Education

Seventh schedule (Article 246)

List III: Concurrent List

25. Education, including technical education, medical education and universities, subject to the provisions of entries 63, 64, 65 and 66 of List I; vocational and technical training of labour.


List II: State List

32. Incorporation, regulation and winding up of corporations, other than those specified in List I, and universities; unincorporated trading, scientific, religious and other societies and associations; cooperative societies.


List I: Union List

- 33. The institutions known at the commencement of this Constitution as the Banaras Hindu University, the Aligarh Muslim University and Delhi University; the University established in pursuance of article 371 E; any other institution declared by Parliament by law to be an institution of national importance.
- 64. Institutions for scientific of technical education financed by the Government of India wholly or in part and declared by Parliament by law to be institutions of national importance.
- 55. Union agencies and institutions for
- a) professional, vocational or technical training, including the training of police officers; or
- b) the promotion of special studies or research; or
- c) scientific or technical assistance in the investigation or detection of crime.
- 66. Co-ordination and determination of standards in institutions for higher education or research and scientific and technical institutions.






GROWTH OF SCHOOL EDUCATION






GROWTH OF SCHOOL EDUCATION






