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# 1. About the National University

The National University, a premier organization of its kind in South Asia, is engaged in capacity building and research in policy making, planning and administration of education. The university is fully maintained by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Apart from other activities of teaching and research, the University is also engaged in preparing skilled manpower through its M. Phil. and Ph.D. programmes for planning and management of education in the country.

The National University maintains a state of the art library, which caters to the needs of the scholars interested to work in the area of educational policy, planning and administration and related interdisciplinary subjects. The library provides latest information to facilitate the faculty, researchers, administrators, policy makers and participants of its capacity building programmes. NUEPA library has a collection of more than 60,000 books. It regularly subscribes to about 240 Indian and foreign journals and periodicals. The library is fully computerized and it provides referencing services through Internet, ERIC and DELNET based virtual library mode.

The University's Documentation Centre has a wide and rich collection of more than 18,500 volumes on educational planning and administration. The Documentation Centre offers a unique collection of official reports, documents and other government publications such as state gazetteers, state census

reports, world handbooks, educational surveys, five-year plans, etc. It also holds a rich collection of dissertations of the University's Diploma Course in Educational Planning and Administration (DEPA) and International Diploma Course in Educational Planning and Administration (IDEPA). # 2. M. Phil. - Ph. D. and Ph. D. Programmes 2010-11

The National University offers M. Phil and Ph.D. programmes in educational planning and administration from a broader inter-disciplinary social science perspective. The three programmes leading to M.Phil. and Ph.D. degrees are as under:

- i. M.Phil. Programme
- ii. Full-time Ph. D. Programme
- iii. Part-time Ph. D. Programme

These programmes are designed to build the research capacity of scholars from varied backgrounds and provide a strong knowledge and skill base in related areas of educational policy, planning, administration and finance. The research studies completed under the M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes are expected to make significant contributions in enriching the

knowledge base, besides providing critical inputs for policy formulation, implementation of reform programmes and capacity building activities. The broad areas of research covering all levels and types of education would be as under:

- Educational Policy
- Educational Planning
- Educational Administration
- Educational Finance
- Educational Management Information System
- School Education

- Higher Education
- Equity and Inclusion in Education
- Gender Issues in Education
- Education of the Minority
- Comparative Education
- Education and Globalization

Details within these broad areas are listed in Annexure-L.

The National University follows all mandatory provisions in the reservation policy of the Government of India for admission to its M.Phil. and Ph. D. Programmes.

# 3. Eligibility

### 3.1 M. Phil. Programme

- (a) Candidates seeking admission to the M.Phil. Programme shall have minimum of 55% marks (50% for SC/ST and Persons with Disabilities (PWD) candidates) or its equivalent grade in Master's Degree in Social Sciences and allied disciplines from a recognized university. Candidate possessing Master's degree in other areas may also be considered if he/she has proven record of work/publication in the area of educational policy, planning and administration.
- (b) The NET qualified candidates, who have been awarded Junior Research Fellowships by the UGC, with the above-mentioned educational qualifications are encouraged to apply.
- (c) Candidates who are yet to clear their final examination at the Master's level are also eligible to apply provided they pass the examination as per the eligibility conditions laid down at I & II above and submit its proof at the time of the interview. The University reserves the right to cancel the admission of such candidates who are unable to produce the evidence of passing the Master's degree by first week of July 2010.
- (d) In 2010-11, a maximum of 20 scholars shall be selected for admission to the M. Phil. programme.

### 3.2 Full-time Ph. D. Programme

- The university also offers admission to Ph. D. Programme for candidate with M.Phil. Degree in
  an area closely related to educational policy, planning and administration in addition to the
  qualifications mentioned in Para 3.I (a) above and/or having exceptionally brilliant academic
  record in social sciences/allied areas coupled with publications of high quality.
- 2. M.Phil. graduates of NUEPA will be eligible for admission to the Ph.D. Programme after due scrutiny by a Selection/Admission Committee, if they obtain a FGPA of 6 or above on the ten point scale. This will be applicable for all admissions from 2008 onwards.

### 3.3 Part-time Ph. D. Programme

University also offers Part- time Ph. D. Programme based on the criteria as laid down in the rules of the university. A candidate seeking admission to Part-time Ph.D. programme is required to meet the following criteria:

- i. Should possess the educational qualifications as mentioned in Para 3.I (a) above;
- ii. Currently, should be in full-time employment;
- iii. Should be a senior level educational functionary with a minimum of five years work experience in teaching, educational planning and administration.

### 4. Selection and Admission

Candidates may apply in the prescribed form(separately for each programme) for admission to M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes of the University along with three copies of the brief write-up on the proposed research topic on a contemporary issue within the broad framework of educational policy, planning and administration.

The duly filled-in application along with the demand draft and three copies of the brief write-up on any one of the proposed area(s) of research around 2500 words within the broad areas of educational policy, planning, administration and finance as per the outline given below should be sent by registered post to the Registrar so as to reach him latest by 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2010. The envelope should be distinctly marked as Admission to M. Phil. <u>OR</u> Ph.D. <u>OR</u> Part-time Ph. D. Programme

2010. The filled-in application can also be submitted in person to the office of the Registrar. Candidates already in employment should send their application for admission to Part-time Ph.D. programme through proper channel.

The brief write-up should be structured around the proposed topic incorporating therein the importance of the topic, the analytical review of the existing literature on the chosen topic and the research issues proposed to be addressed by the candidate. In each area mentioned, the focus of the proposed write-up should specifically bear upon aspects related to educational policy, planning, administration and finance as the case may be Suggested outline for the brief write-up is given as under:

- Statement of the problem/topic
- Rationale of the study, i.e. importance and need for the proposed study;
- Brief review of related literature:
- Objectives/research questions:
- Design of the study;
- Proposed methodology:
- Database and instruments for data collection (if any)
- Expected outcomes; and
- Implications of the proposed research.

Besides providing an idea regarding the area of research proposed to be pursued by the candidate, the write-up may also be used by the University as one of the parameters for initial short-listing of applications. It may be underlined that applications having the brief write-up not related to any of the research areas mentioned in the Prospectus would be rejected in the initial stage of screening.

Only the short-listed candidates will be Computer Lab invited for interview through which the



University will assess the general awareness of the candidate about the educational issues, and chosen topic, comprehension of research literature and ability to interpret data and draw inferences.

Scholars of the M. Phil. and Ph.D. Programmes are expected to be present in the University for the whole duration of the programme. The programmes shall commence from Second week of July 2010.

Part-time Ph. D. scholars are also expected to be available in the campus for limited period besides attendance at the course work to fulfill the academic requirements of the programme as prescribed in the rules and regulations of the university.

# 5. Programme Duration

### 5.1 M. Phil. Programme

Under this programme, the University offers M. Phil. degree (two-years duration) which may lead to Ph.D. subject to fulfillment of the requirements as laid down in its rules and regulations. The two-year M. Phil. programme comprises one year of course work followed by one year for dissertation work.

Of the scholars who successfully complete the M. Phil. programme of the University and meet the prescribed criteria (presently FGPA of 6 or above on the ten point scale) would be considered for admission and registration to the Ph. D. programme. Such scholars are eligible to submit their Doctoral thesis only after two years of registration for the Ph. D. programme.

### **5.2** Ph. D. Programme

Scholars admitted to the Ph. D. Programme are expected to complete the one year course work before confirmation of their Ph. D. registration after which they are eligible to submit their thesis after two years of registration for the Ph.D. programme.

### 5.3 Part-time Ph. D. Programme

A part-time Ph. D. scholar would be eligible for submission of his/her Ph. D. thesis after a minimum period of four years from the date of registration for the Ph.D. programme.

#### **Notes:**

- (a) A scholar, in consultation with his/her supervisor(s), will have to identify, prepare and submit the research synopsis latest by the end of the first year of his/her programme of study. This will be a necessary condition for confirming registration of the full-time scholars.
- (b) Once confirmed as a full-time scholar, he/she shall work on the approved research topic for a minimum period of one year to be eligible to submit his/her M. Phil. Dissertation, and two years after registration in the Ph.D. programme, to be eligible to submit his/her Ph. D. thesis.
- (c) The scholar shall submit through his/her supervisor(s) five copies of the M. Phil. Dissertation along with five copies of the abstract within 12 months from the date of confirmation of registration to the M. Phil. programme.
- (d) The scholar shall submit through his/her supervisor(s) five copies of the Ph. D. thesis not prior to two years (for Full-time scholars) and four years (for Part-time scholars) from the date of confirmation of registration to the Ph. D. programme. Besides, the scholar shall also submit five
  - copies of the abstract of the thesis in not more than 2500 words. He/she shall also be required to make a presentation of the research work in a seminar, at least three months prior to submission of the thesis.
- (e) All the three programmes will be governed by the rules and regulation of the National University of Educational Planning and Administration.

### 6.2 Fellowships

Candidates admitted for the M.Phil. and Full-time Ph.D. programmes will be provided fellowship by the University. Candidates who have qualified the National EligibilityTest (NET) with Junior Research Fellowships awarded by the UGC will draw the same through the National University as per the norms and procedures laid down by the UGC. However, the continuation of the fellowship shall be subject to the satisfactory progress report of the scholars duly approved by his/her supervisor.

The scholars of the M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes would be required to provide part-time assistance in the research and training programmes of the National University.

# 7. Programme Structure

### 7.1 M. Phil. and Ph. D. Programmes

M.Phil. will be offered in two parts:

Part I	Course work
Part II	Dissertation work

Ph.D. programmes (Full-time & Part-time) will be offered in two parts:

Part I	Course work		
Part II	Thesis work		

#### **Course Work**

Course work is of one year duration. Three Compulsory courses and Two Optional courses (to be opted from a list of sixteen courses) are of four credits each except the Compulsory course on Research Methodology and Statistics which will carry eight credits and field study of two credits; totaling to 30 credits.

The four Compulsory Papers will be transacted in the first eight months, while the optional papers will be covered in the last four months of the first year.

#### **Dissertation**

After the successful completion of course work the M. Phil, scholar is required to work for the

Dissertation, from the beginning of the second year, which will lead to M. Phil. degree.

#### **Thesis**

The scholars registered for Ph. D. Programmes will work on an approved topic and submit the thesis under an identified supervisor. After evaluation, successful scholars shall be awarded Ph. D. degree.

### 8. Evaluation

The course work of the M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes will be assessed through Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) which will be based on multiple sources, criteria and techniques of assessment. It would provide enough feedback and space for improvement. Scheme of Evaluation will involve assessment on the basis of Seminar Presentation, Term Paper, Book Review, Field Attachment, etc. At the end of the course work, there shall be written examination.

The M. Phil. dissertation and Ph. D. thesis will be evaluated by both the internal and external examiners, which will be followed by viva-voce in each case.

## 10. General Conditions

- (i) A scholar admitted for M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes of the National University shall not be allowed to pursue any other course leading to a degree or diploma. Such concurrent activity, if brought to notice, shall call for cancellation of admission to the M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes.
- (ii) A Full-time scholar shall not take up any temporary or permanent employment outside NUEPA during the entire duration of the M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes.
- (iii) Candidates who are already in employment shall have to submit 'No Objection Certificate' from their respective employers while applying for any of the M. Phil. and Ph. D. Programmes of the University.
- (iv) Scholars shall have to clear all dues before submission of the M.Phil. Dissertation and Ph. D. Thesis.
- (v) Scholars of the M. Phil. and Ph. D programmes of the National University shall have to observe the condition of residence in **Delhi** during the respective programmes. However, in connection with the research work/field work, they may be allowed to go out of station with the prior permission of the supervisor(s).





## **ORGANIZATIONAL SET-UP**


